## **Covid Testing and Symptoms - Reminder**

We are pleased that so far we haven't had to close any class bubbles at Holly Lodge and want to keep it that way. If your child displays any of the Covid symptoms, you will need to arrange a Covid test. I realise that this may inconvenience parents, but by doing this you are protecting all of our children and our families. The three main symptoms are a new, persistent cough, change in sense of smell or taste, raised temperature. Even if your child displays only one of these symptoms, you will still need to arrange a test.

**We would like to remind parents that lateral flow device (LFD) tests are not sufficient for use when children are displaying Covid symptoms. These are designed for asymptomatic testing only and cannot be used in lieu of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test. Unfortunately we cannot accept symptomatic pupils back to school unless they have a negative PCR test.**
